



Report on “China-Latin American Youth Responding to Global Challenges —— 2025 Poverty Alleviation Challenge” Program

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To Friends Concerned about the 2025 “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program:

We are pleased to report the successful completion of the main event of the "China-Latin American Youth Responding to Global Challenges — 2025 Poverty Alleviation Challenge" (hereinafter referred to as the 2025 “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program) from April to August 2025, co-organized by Tsinghua University, the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro, Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile, the University of the Pacific, and Minera Las Bambas S.A. The event received strong support from the Chinese Embassy in Brazil, the Chinese Consulate in Rio de Janeiro, the Chinese Embassy in Chile, the Chinese Embassy in Peru, the Brazilian Embassy in China, and the Chilean Embassy in China. It attracted widespread attention from government, business, and academic sectors, and generated significant influence across Latin American countries including Brazil, Chile, and Peru.

To systematically review and share the program’s achievements, the Tsinghua University Latin America Center has compiled this report, summarizing the entire process of the competition. On behalf of the program team, I would like to present to you the implementation and outcomes of the 2025 “Poverty Alleviation Challenge.” This report will cover several dimensions, including the background and significance of the event, the collaboration network, key highlights and innovative practices, introductions to award-winning teams and projects, overall outcomes and long-term impact, as well as concluding reflections and future outlook.

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I. Background and Significance of the Event

Poverty alleviation is both a common challenge faced by developing countries and a shared global concern. In the context of unprecedented global changes unseen in a century, poverty alleviation has become an urgent and pressing challenge requiring swift global response. General Secretary Xi Jinping has repeatedly addressed the importance of joint global efforts to tackle poverty alleviation challenges in speeches delivered at various international and domestic forums. As early as the 2015 High-Level Forum on Poverty Alleviation and Development, he called for “building a community with a shared future for mankind free from poverty and advancing the global poverty alleviation process and international cooperation”.

In recent years, China-Latin America relations have entered a new era of comprehensive and rapid development. President Xi Jinping and Latin American heads of state have emphasized the significance of China-Latin America poverty alleviation cooperation on multiple occasions. During his visit to China in 2023, Brazilian President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva noted that “Brazil hopes to deepen cooperation with China to help address issues such as poverty eradication.” Following their talks, President Xi Jinping and President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva signed several bilateral cooperation agreements in areas including trade, investment, and poverty alleviation. In 2025, the Beijing Declaration of the Fourth China-Latin America Cooperation Forum Ministerial Meeting further called for deepening cooperation and exchanges in poverty alleviation, providing greater confidence for expanding the influence of this program across Latin America and even globally.

Youth represents the future of a nation. As students of Tsinghua University, China’s top academic institution, we should embody the courage and sense of responsibility required to actively confront and address real-world challenges. As General Secretary Xi Jinping expressed his expectations for the younger generation, “The relationship between nations lies in the closeness of their people, and this closeness must begin with the youth. We should deepen exchanges and mutual learning, building a spiritual home of harmony in diversity with an inclusive mindset”.



In this spirit, the program brings together young scholars from the top universities of **China, Chile, Brazil and Peru** to jointly address the global challenge of poverty. Although students come from different countries, cultures, and disciplines, they are united by a shared mission of poverty alleviation. Through participating in poverty alleviation competitions, they observe the diverse manifestations of poverty, explore the conditions for its eradication through field research informed by their academic expertise, learn from one another, and ultimately develop solutions across a range of disciplines. While deepening their understanding of real-world poverty issues, the program also promotes cultural exchange and mutual learning among civilizations, enhances the global competence of young students, and strives to fulfill the General Secretary's call to action for youth: "We must join hands with global youth to promote world peace and development through youthful energy!"

As a world-renowned top-tier institution with global influence, Tsinghua University bears both the responsibility and the mission to contribute to global poverty alleviation efforts. By leveraging its academic influence, extensive partnerships, specialized research, and innovative practices, Tsinghua seeks to promote international youth cooperation in the field of poverty alleviation. In 2024, Tsinghua University Latin American Center, Research Center for China-Latin America Management Studies, SEM, Tsinghua University; Center for Global Competence Development at Tsinghua University collaborated with Latin American university partners successfully launched and implemented the "China-Latin America Youth Responding to Global Challenges — 2024 Poverty Alleviation Challenge" program in China, Brazil, and Chile. This initiative sparked a wave of university-led poverty alleviation dialogues across China and Latin America. In November 2024, during President Xi Jinping's state visit to Brazil for the 19th G20 Leaders' Summit, Tsinghua University Party Secretary Qiu Yong signed a cooperation agreement with the President of the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro on the "China-Latin America Youth Responding to Global Challenges" program. This agreement was included in the outcomes of Xi Jinping's visit and became a significant example of China-Latin America collaboration. It has also been acclaimed by mainstream media in both regions as "a youthful force in global governance."



Following the success of 2024, Professor Chen Taotao—Lead Professor of the “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program and Director of the Tsinghua University Latin America Center—initiated preparations for the “2025 Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program in November of last year. All activities have proceeded in an orderly manner, and the main components of the program (except for the cultural immersion visit to China by the winning student teams from Latin America, scheduled for January 2026) have now been successfully completed. We remain committed to harnessing the collective wisdom of Chinese and Latin American youth, continuously contributing to the building of a more inclusive and sustainable global development landscape.

The long-term and profound significance of this program lies in:

➤ For **China-Latin America cooperation**, the Poverty Alleviation Challenge program serves as a vital platform for cross-border exchanges of poverty alleviation achievements and experiences. By establishing a multi-stakeholder and cross-sectoral dialogue and collaboration network that connects government, industry, and academia, it empowers young students to design cross-cultural, interdisciplinary, replicable, and implementable poverty alleviation solutions. This initiative creates new opportunities to advance cultural exchange and mutual benefit between China and Latin American countries.

➤ For **China-Latin America University**, On the one hand, the “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program leverages the transnational curriculum “China–Latin America Youth Responding to Global Challenges” jointly developed by Tsinghua University, Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile, the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro, and the University of the Pacific. The program integrates competitions, forums, and field research to facilitate resource sharing and complementarity among universities in the field of poverty alleviation, demonstrating both pioneering significance and strong potential for broader implementation. On the other hand, it contributes to cultivating students’ global competence and provides innovative approaches to nurture ambassadors of friendship between China and Latin America.

➤ For **young students**, Youth represent an emerging force in advancing poverty alleviation.



The “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program offers Chinese and Latin American students valuable opportunities to strengthen their global competence. Through cross-cultural exchanges, professional empowerment, and diverse competition mechanisms, it enhances students’ capacity to address poverty-related challenges. This initiative fosters collaboration among Chinese and Latin American youth, jointly injecting youthful wisdom and vitality into global development.

The 2025 Poverty Alleviation Challenge program will further implement the directives from the China-Latin America leaders to enhance bilateral exchanges and cultural mutual learning. Building on the 2024 program, it will intensify innovation efforts by integrating academic resources from Chinese and Latin American universities, promoting project development and incubation, fostering interdisciplinary collaboration, attracting more high-quality students and mentors, and empowering the development and implementation of effective poverty alleviation outcomes.

III. Highlights of the Event: Pool Global Efforts to Build a New Ecosystem for Poverty Alleviation

The “2025 Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program enriches its activities through regional competition formats, cross-border courses, and a comprehensive “Study-Competition-Research” training mechanism. By connecting international experts with young talents through integrating theory with practice and combining scientific research with competitions, it cultivates globally competent youth professionals to jointly address global poverty alleviation challenges. Highlights of this year’s innovative initiatives include:

1. Transnational two-stage competition system, enabling mutual learning between civilizations in both directions

The event featured three main competition zones across China and Latin America, divided into two stages: the “Preliminary Round” and the “International Final”. An integrated operational mechanism was established, linking the main competition venues at universities in **China, Brazil, and Chile**. Scholars from government, industry, and academia in pan-Latin American countries, including Peru and Ecuador, also participated, forging an exchange bond for China-Latin America poverty alleviation practices. The preliminary rounds was held in China (Tsinghua University) in June 2025, conducted through a hybrid online-offline format. The winning teams received full funding to travel to Brazil (Federal University of Rio de Janeiro) and Chile (Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile) for the finals in August 2025. The winning Latin American students also received full funding to study in China in January 2026, fostering deeper cultural exchanges through cultural immersion.

The core links of the event are as follows, and the corresponding event timeline is shown in Table 1:

- **Ice-breaking session:** This includes toolbox introductions, competition format explanations, cross-border team formation, and project briefings, designed to help students quickly familiarize themselves with the competition rules and resources. Participating teams can recruit teammates through existing project presentations,



fostering interaction and collaboration between domestic and international students.

- **Field research:** Organize participating students to visit poverty alleviation bases and enterprises, and deepen their understanding of global poverty alleviation cases based on practical cases.
- **Forum dialogue:** Diversified forms of communication such as “expert lectures” and “expert forums” were set up to invite scholars, entrepreneurs and policy experts from China and Latin America to discuss hot topics in the field of global poverty alleviation, so as to provide students with cutting-edge theoretical reserves.
- **Mentorship:** There are two types of professional mentor teams throughout the competition.

Academic mentors: The doctoral team of Tsinghua University sets up academic mentors to help the competition team master the analysis tools and methods required by the competition through theoretical explanation and practical operation guidance.

Professional mentors: Invite experts from the government, industry and research fields in the field of poverty alleviation and sustainable development to provide guidance for the participating teams on project optimization, innovation and incubation.

- **Project design and presentation:** the team completed the poverty alleviation project according to the research results, and carried out centralized reporting and evaluation.
- **Project implementation:** promote the project incubation and implementation through expert guidance and cross-border cooperation.

The 2025 Poverty Alleviation Challenge program Preliminary Competition was held at Tsinghua University on June 7 through a hybrid online-offline format, attracting over 310 faculty and students from 27 universities across China and Latin America. A total of 102 teams participated, including 39 cross-border teams. Tsinghua University's 22 teams presented poverty alleviation solutions on-site, while over 70 teams from Latin American universities competed online, showcasing the event's global reach and fostering cross-cultural collaboration in addressing global poverty issues. After rigorous evaluation, 12 teams advanced to the international finals.

The 2025 Poverty Alleviation Challenge program finals will be held in two regional venues: Brazil (August 13–15) and Chile (August 20–22). Through diverse sessions, the event aims to enhance youth's practical capabilities in poverty alleviation, build cross-cultural exchange platforms, and explore sustainable innovative pathways for China-Latin America cooperation. During field research, participants gained firsthand insights into art-driven poverty alleviation and grassroots governance practices. Academic seminars delved into cutting-edge topics in



AI-powered poverty alleviation, while coaching sessions provided professional guidance to strengthen project feasibility. The final presentation phase showcases the seamless integration of youth innovation with local realities.

2. Multi-stakeholder collaborative expansion and enterprise deep involvement

In terms of expanding the partner network, this year's Poverty Alleviation Challenge program achieved comprehensive breakthroughs and upgrades.

In the terms of geographical coverage, while consolidating core regions such as China, Brazil, and Chile, the program officially included **Peru** for the first time as a participating country, significantly enhancing its reach and influence across Latin America.

In the terms of participating institutions, while maintaining university participation as the main component, the program innovatively introduced corporate practical forces. **Minera Las Bambas S.A.**—as the first enterprise representative to join the Poverty Alleviation Challenge program—brought valuable practical insights and industry wisdom to the event through its extensive experience in community development and poverty alleviation practices in Latin America.

In terms of partner institutions, the program established strategic collaborations with multiple renowned domestic and international organizations, including Envision Group, Chile's CGE Group, professional institutions such as the China International poverty alleviation Center, as well as Tsinghua University's School of Architecture, Department of Industrial Engineering, Institute for Accessibility Development, Law School, School of Civil Engineering, and XuetangX, among other academic units spanning multiple disciplines.

These partners will provide full-process support from practical topic selection, project guidance to evaluation, collectively building a sustainable development ecosystem characterized by deep integration of industry, academia, and research with multi-stakeholder collaboration.

3. Integration of curriculum and competition, knowledge sharing and innovation linkage

Tsinghua University, together with major partner universities in Chile and Brazil, jointly launched a transnational course “Chinese and Latin American Youth Responding to Global



Challenges” in 2025, aiming to achieve the following linkage:

- **Sharing course resources:** Open the course resources to partners and competitors from China, Chile, Brazil, Peru and other countries participating in the “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program.
- **Establish China-Latin America Cloud Lecture Class**

The program will hold two major academic lectures from April to May 2025, bringing together core experts in the field of poverty alleviation from China, Brazil and Chile. The purpose is to enhance students’ understanding ability and comparative vision on development issues in the Global South through in-depth dialogue between experts from China, Brazil and Chile.

The inaugural lecture, titled “Pathways to poverty alleviation in Technology and Social Development”, was held on April 24, 2025. UNDP China Chief Economist Violante di Canossa presented AI applications in poverty alleviation across the Global South. Professor Maria Luisa Mendez and Magdalena Valdes from the Catholic University of Chile shared insights on how urban-rural social cohesion and ecological conservation contribute to poverty alleviation.

The second lecture, held on May 8, 2025, explored “Poverty Alleviation Experiences from Local Practices and International Perspectives”. The team of Guizhou’s Village Football Program presented rural revitalization strategies through cultural-sports-industry integration. Scholars Pedro Fandino and Paula Carvalho from the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, analyzed the evolution of poverty and inequality along with their policy implications.

- **Promote AI-related courses:** To empower participating teams to explore technological pathways for poverty alleviation, we collaborate with Tsinghua University’s XuetangX platform to curate cutting-edge courses on AI and poverty alleviation, building an AI-for-poverty-alleviation learning system integrating “technological tools + real-world applications”. The curriculum is freely accessible to global participants and educators, complemented by expert lectures and digital certification programs. This effort helps young professionals integrate AI innovations into poverty

alleviation design, fostering deeper integration of digital technologies with development-related issues.

4. Dual-driven paradigm upgrading and deep integration of academic and practical practices

As a platform for exploring the intersection of poverty alleviation theory and practice, the “2025 Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program adheres to the dual-wheel drive paradigm, strives to achieve a win-win situation between academic research and practical innovation, and showcases the valuable achievements of multidimensional cooperation paths in poverty alleviation between China and Latin America:

In the field of research collaboration, this program employs the “5W1H+” theoretical framework from Tsinghua University’s poverty alleviation Toolkit developed by Professor Chen Taotao’s team at the Tsinghua University Latin American Center. By systematically compiling cross-institutional case studies, it has established an innovative research system for poverty alleviation. The academic monograph “Chinese and Latin American Youth Responding to Global Challenges —— Poverty Alleviation”, based on 2024 research findings, is now in the publication process. This work contributes replicable and scalable academic paradigms and practical approaches to global poverty alleviation efforts.

In the field of practical implementation, this program has established a youth-driven China-Latin America poverty alleviation cooperation platform. Through two phases — preliminary competitions and cross-border finals — it creates an integrated global competence development chain encompassing ice-breaking sessions, field research, forum dialogues, mentorship sessions, and solution design and presentations. By implementing modular competition tracks, the initiative guides young scholars from both sides to independently select research directions, form cross-border innovative teams, and systematically decode poverty alleviation case studies while developing innovative solutions. This approach achieves dual empowerment between academic research and social value creation.

5. China-Latin America mentors collaborated across disciplines, innovatively encouraging transnational cooperation

The 2025 “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program gathered **75 professional mentors from China (37), Chile (30), Brazil (4), and Peru (4)**, covering multiple fields such as artificial intelligence, financial empowerment, environmental protection, and corporate social responsibility, forming a cross-regional and interdisciplinary guidance force. During the preliminary stage, the organizing team developed an online reservation system to support participating teams in flexibly selecting mentors and receiving personalized guidance through virtual meetings, question checklists, and other formats. In the final stage, a valuable opportunity was offered for the winning teams to engage in face-to-face exchanges with their China-Latin America mentors. These mentors met in person with the winning teams for in-depth discussions. Through their professional guidance and interdisciplinary exchange, the mentors helped the teams further refine their project design and implementation strategies.

The mentors focused on core topics including the scientific validity of research topics, stakeholder analysis, identification of key pain points, strategic innovation, and feasibility of cross-border applications, guiding students to deepen solution design by integrating real-world poverty scenarios, significantly enhancing the professionalism and implementation potential of projects. The establishment and efficient operation of the global mentor network provided solid intellectual and practical support for participating projects, laying important groundwork for subsequent incubation and promotion of outcomes.

This year of the competition has achieved innovative breakthroughs in team formation mechanisms as well, pioneering the initiative to organize participating teams through “cross-border collaboration”. Chinese and Latin American youth can precisely match professional backgrounds, skill orientations, and cooperation intentions via online platforms. Each team is encouraged to include members from at least two different countries, aiming to spark cross-cultural intellectual exchanges and cultivate collaborative capabilities for addressing global challenges among young people. At the finals in Brazil and Chile, cross-border team members gained valuable opportunities for face-to-face interaction, effectively breaking down cultural barriers and genuinely fostering cross-cultural learning and mutual understanding.

The organic integration of a multicultural mentorship system and innovative team formation model has created a global learning environment for participating teams. Mentors from diverse cultural backgrounds provide rich academic support and practical guidance to multinational teams through their multifaceted professional perspectives. Transnational teams effectively understand and absorb mentors' cross-cultural expertise, transforming diverse wisdom into actionable solutions. Within this two-way interactive learning ecosystem, mentors' interdisciplinary knowledge and students' global practices mutually nourish each other, expanding the global perspective of solutions while enhancing local adaptability.

6. Building a long-term cooperative ecosystem to promote sustainable incubation of poverty alleviation programs

The “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program competition is dedicated to building a sustainable cooperation ecosystem and promoting the incubation and implementation of poverty alleviation initiatives.

On one hand, the event focuses on actively exploring the construction of poverty alleviation practice bases as a key initiative, creating an on-site visit and exchange platform for Chinese and Latin American youth. Through organizing frontline field studies, immersive workshops, and cross-cultural dialogues, it facilitates the deep integration of theory and practice. On the other hand, it innovatively collaborates with Tsinghua University departments and corporate partners to



develop real-world challenges. Departmental experts and industry practitioners jointly provide competition topics closely aligned with practical needs, while integrating resources from multinational institutions to systematically explore sustainable pathways from “competition outcomes” to “regional promotion”. These measures not only lay a solid foundation for future development of China-Latin America poverty alleviation practice bases but also strengthen the long-term impact of cooperative models validated through practice. This provides a replicable and scalable collaboration paradigm for global poverty alleviation efforts.



IV. Introduction of Award-Winning Team and Projects

The 2025 “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program event brought together over 310 teachers and students from 27 universities and enterprises across China, Brazil, Chile, and Peru. The participating teams proposed a series of innovative solutions combining theory with practice, addressing global poverty alleviation issues. The project themes covered multiple topics including education, agriculture, artificial intelligence, green buildings, and elderly health, showcasing the innovative capabilities and practical potential of young teams in the field of global poverty alleviation.

Among all the participating projects, after evaluation by a jury composed of experts from Chinese and Latin American, 12 teams successfully advanced to the finals. Their projects covered multiple aspects including **AI technology applications, sustainable building materials, inclusive development, clean energy, and smart agriculture**. The advancing teams underwent “project optimization” and “final presentations” during the competition phase, competing and learning from each other in the Brazilian and Chilean finals, ultimately selected as gold, silver, and bronze award winners.

1. Finalists and projects from the Brazil final

After intense competition, **the Tsinghua University team “Sol Verde”** emerged as the champion. Their innovative project in Brazil's Sertão region focuses on implementing agrivoltaic systems that combine crop cultivation with solar power generation. This approach not only boosts land productivity but also creates new revenue streams for local communities while enhancing climate resilience.

The silver award was awarded to the **“Marla Community Empowerment Program (LLaqta Team)”** jointly formed by Peru's Minera Las Bambas S.A. and the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro, which helps farmers in Peru's Marla region improve production efficiency and income levels through agricultural technology training, cooperative development, and financial literacy promotion. Additionally, the **“China Yunnan-Kunshan Coffee Industry Chain Empowering Brazil's Smart Logistics (TransPobreza Pioneer)”** project from Tsinghua



University and the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro drew inspiration from China's "Yunnan-Suzhou Coffee Model" to propose a comprehensive action plan for optimizing Brazil's coffee transportation system, aiming to promote industrial chain upgrading and increase farmers' income.

The three bronze award-winning teams are: **TsingLex**, a team of students from Tsinghua University and Brazil's FGV School of Law, which provides affordable legal services through an AI platform to enhance accessibility for disadvantaged groups; **Minerva Acendere**, a team from the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro, which improves energy access in slums through distributed photovoltaic projects while emphasizing community participation and sustainable development; and **Integrated Workshop**, a team composed students from Tsinghua University, the University of Chile, and the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro. They created a handicraft employment platform for people with disabilities, leveraging AI technology to help people with disabilities achieve income growth and social integration.

2. Finalists and projects from the Chile final

The finalist teams showcased projects addressing key themes including clean energy utilization, agricultural and water resource innovation, industrial upgrading and community development, as well as digital platforms for employment promotion. Leveraging their disciplinary expertise and cross-cultural perspectives, teams proposed diverse strategies and innovative solutions to tackle poverty challenges. These initiatives spanned multiple dimensions: developing eco-friendly building materials from mining waste, expanding off-grid photovoltaic energy systems, constructing modular emergency housing, exploring sustainable clean water supply solutions, and creating community innovation hubs alongside digital employment platforms.

After fierce competition, **the team “Shining Micro-Dreams” from Tsinghua University and the University of Chile** ultimately claimed the championship. Their project draws on China’s “Mama Water Cellar” experience by introducing a distributed collection and centralized processing model, aiming to provide sustainable solutions for water-scarce regions in northern Chile. Through new energy initiatives, the project not only improves drinking water and electricity supply but also promotes cultural exchanges between communities and AI-based information sharing, benefiting residents in terms of livelihood, safety, and communication. By breaking down information barriers, it helps communities achieve poverty alleviation and prosperity.

The “Pacíficos Peruanos” team from Peru’s Pacific University earned a silver award. Their project focuses on clean water supply solutions in Peru’s coastal, highland, and Amazon regions, improving water access through sustainable and innovative approaches to improve water conditions and support poverty alleviation and public welfare. **The multinational team “Resilio” from Tsinghua University, Federal University of Rio de Janeiro, and the University of Chile** also received a silver award. Their modular emergency shelter system utilizes foldable houses that provide temporary shelters during disasters and can be converted into community service facilities post-disaster, helping vulnerable groups in Latin America enhance their disaster response capabilities and long-term development capacity.



The multinational team “Minova”, comprising members from the Catholic University of Chile, University of Santiago, University of Chile, and Tsinghua University, was awarded both the bronze medal and the Audience Choice Award. Their project utilizes mining waste to create sustainable building materials while exploring community-based sustainable business models to boost local development and poverty alleviation. The “Equity Pioneers” team from the Catholic University of Chile, Tsinghua University, and Federal University of Rio de Janeiro also earned a bronze award. They proposed establishing a network of community-oriented maker spaces to provide rural residents with essential tools, modern technology, and professional guidance, thereby unlocking their design and innovation potential. Another team “Pega Paga Bien” from Tsinghua University and the University of Chile received a bronze medal for developing a digital platform designed to expand employment opportunities for immigrants and youth, helping them better integrate into society and improve their livelihoods.

V. Results and Prospects

1. Effectiveness of Activities

Amid a global landscape marked by multiple challenges and a world entering a new era of turbulence and transformation, youth remain a vital force in driving social progress and sustainable development. Their capacity for transnational collaboration and innovation is therefore of particular importance. The 2025 “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program not only built upon the successful experience of the inaugural 2024 event but also achieved new breakthroughs in its scale, depth, and influence. The specific outcomes are as follows:

(1) Innovative Paradigm: Deepening a New Platform for China-Latin America Youth Cooperation on Poverty Alleviation

- The 2025 “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program further deepened the innovative paradigm for China-Latin America youth cooperation on poverty alleviation. Using the synergy of transnational multi-zone linkage and the deep integration of government, industry, academia, and research as its engine, the program solidified a practical platform



for Chinese and Latin American youth to collaboratively address global challenges. The core of this paradigm lies in its forward-looking top-level design and efficient execution, effectively breaking down geographical and disciplinary barriers. The program connected top universities and institutions from multiple countries, including China, Brazil, Chile, and Peru, forming a vast cooperative network. This year's event attracted over 310 young participants and involved 102 transnational teams from 27 universities and corporate institutions, a scale that demonstrates its powerful appeal and platform effect.

- The program fostered genuine cross-cultural exchange among students and faculty from top Chinese and Latin American universities by building a three-dimensional model: “Competition + Curriculum + Practice”. This model organically integrates theoretical learning, solution-based competition, and on-site research. The “Curriculum” module invited academic experts and industry leaders from across China and Latin America to provide youth with cutting-edge knowledge on poverty alleviation theory, sustainable development, and regional country conditions. The “Competition” module stimulated young people's creativity and teamwork through innovative contest mechanisms. The “Practice” module arranged in-depth field research in communities and enterprises, closely linking theoretical knowledge with real-world problems. This immersive, multi-layered interactive model greatly enriched the participants' experience and sense of achievement.

- The program's appeal and value have been highly recognized by partner universities. In the founding stage of the program, university partners in Brazil, Chile, and Peru responded immediately to Tsinghua University's invitation. Throughout the program's progress, we have continued to receive active feedback from our partners, who regard this as the first program they have encountered with such rich and substantial cross-cultural exchange content. They believe the program holds a tangible and palpable real significance for increasing mutual understanding between China and Latin America and fostering trust and friendship. This genuine voice from frontline participants and organizers is the most powerful proof of the program's effectiveness, demonstrating that the “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program is not just an academic and



competition program, but a bridge connecting the hearts and minds of Chinese and Latin American youth.

(2) Deep Empowerment: Enhancing China-Latin America Youth's Comprehensive Ability to Respond to Global Challenges

- **This event genuinely enhanced the capacity of Chinese and Latin American youth to collectively address global poverty alleviation challenges.** The program's empowerment system was meticulously designed to provide youth with systematic knowledge, methodology, and practical experience, achieving a comprehensive upgrade from “understanding” to “action”.

- **One of the core tools for empowerment was methodological innovation.** The program created the Tsinghua “5W1H+” Poverty Alleviation Toolkit, providing students with a methodology for poverty analysis. The “5W1H+” Toolkit (What, When, Where, Why, Who, How) is an innovative analytical framework designed to systematically dissect poverty situations, analyze causes, build multi-stakeholder networks, and drive the implementation of poverty alleviation strategies. This toolkit was not merely a theoretical model but was widely applied during the event—for instance, in analyzing outstanding poverty alleviation cases from companies like State Grid Brazil Holding and Chile's CGE Group. It guided students to approach complex issues in a structured and logical manner, earning high praise for its applicability and inspiration.

- **The path to achieving empowerment was deep cross-cultural collaboration.** The program promoted cross-ocean partnership between Chinese and Latin American youth through a transnational team mechanism. This mechanism intentionally required students from different cultural backgrounds, knowledge structures, and linguistic environments to collaborate. While solving real-world problems, they had to learn to listen, understand, compromise, and integrate. This not only honed their cross-cultural communication skills but also subtly fostered deep international friendships.

- **The resource guarantee for empowerment came from top-tier intellectual support.** The program leveraged the expertise of academics and industry experts from multiple countries to empower Chinese and Latin American youth with knowledge and practical experience. From



expert lectures to online and offline coordinated mentorship, and from proposal guidance to on-site evaluation and feedback, the entire program cycle was permeated with high-level intellectual input. This ensured that young participants were able to stand on the “shoulders of giants” when exploring poverty alleviation solutions, thus broadening their vision and deepening their thinking.

(3) Practical Output: Promoting Mutual Learning of Poverty Alleviation Experiences and Localized Implementation of Solutions

The 2025 “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program is not just an exchange platform but also an incubator focused on practical output. The event’s effectiveness is ultimately reflected in the body of high-quality, feasible poverty alleviation solutions it generated.

- **The solutions produced by the program clearly demonstrate the results of mutual learning between Chinese and Latin American poverty alleviation experiences, alongside dedicated efforts toward deep localization, highlighting the innovative strength of China-Latin America youth cooperation in this field.** Chinese youth integrated China’s successful experiences in areas like digital inclusive finance, e-commerce poverty alleviation, and industrial poverty alleviation with the specific national conditions of Latin American countries. Conversely, Latin American youth brought their unique perspectives on community governance, environmental protection, and social entrepreneurship. For example, one team adapted the Chinese concept of “targeted poverty alleviation” to design a sustainable livelihood program for a Peruvian Andean community based on local specialty agricultural products. Another team applied Chile’s experience with community energy projects to explore energy transition in a Chinese village. These proposals generally exhibited profound insight and strong implementability.

- **Knowledge gained from books is ultimately superficial; true understanding comes through practice. These solutions did not merely remain on paper.** Several outstanding proposals have already garnered attention from relevant institutions, and their implementation feasibility is under discussion. For instance, some solutions focusing on online education, clean energy, digital education, and women’s empowerment have already been connected with relevant



companies and the Tsinghua University Latin America Center. This signifies that the results of the Poverty Alleviation Challenge program are poised to transition from “proposals” to “actions”, creating opportunities to further break down barriers and make a genuine, positive impact on local communities.

(4) Broad Collaboration: Uniting Government, Industry, Academia and Research to Promote Sustainable Development

The success of any program largely depends on its ability to build a sustainable, multi-stakeholder, win-win ecosystem. The 2025 “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program achieved breakthroughs in this area.

- **The program’s implementation received widespread attention and gained support and recognition from government, enterprise, and academic sectors, leading to collaboration opportunities with various institutions.** This broad collaborative network is the cornerstone for the smooth execution and continuous expansion of the program’s influence. Prominent companies such as Envision Group, Chile’s CGE Group, and MMG Las Bambas (Peru) generously provided funding and offered valuable support, including youth project topics and mentorship. Institutions including MMG Las Bambas, CGE, CNOOC, and Chile’s Fund for Social Solidarity and Investment (Fondo de Solidaridad e Inversión Social, FOSIS) provided vibrant field research opportunities, allowing students to access the most authentic frontline poverty alleviation scenarios. In terms of policy and diplomatic support, the Chinese Embassies in Brazil, Chile, and Peru, the Chinese Consulate-General in Rio de Janeiro, and the Brazilian and Chilean Embassies in China all became steadfast supporting institutions, offering high-level guidance and assurance for the event’s implementation. This deep integration of government, industry, academia, and research not only injected strong vitality into the program itself but also sent a powerful external signal: it fully demonstrates that poverty alleviation is the most crucial issue for world sustainable development, and is a vivid practice and important implementation of the concepts of building a global community of shared future and the Global Development Initiative proposed by President Xi Jinping.



(5) Far-Reaching Significance: Manifesting the Value of Cooperation and Mutual Benefit in a Changing Global Landscape

- Although the current world is marked by turbulence and volatility, the successful implementation of this program provides a clear example that “cooperation and mutual benefit” remain the deep aspiration of the world’s people, and are the direction for China’s efforts and practice in leading the world toward a better future—a community with shared future for mankind. The 2025 “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program transcended a simple youth event; it cultivated an oasis of cooperation in a shifting global landscape, centered on youth and focused on development. The “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program attracted broad attention from domestic and international media. Nearly 50 major media outlets, including Xinhua News Agency, CGTN, People’s Daily Online, Huanqiu.com, Global Times, CCTY.com, China Youth Daily, China.org.cn, Beijing Daily Online, Tencent News, Sina News, Sohu.com, NetEase, Phoenix News, China Daily, Jinri Toutiao, The Globe and Mail, and Barchart, published over 61 reports, leading to approximately 500 re-posts by foreign media. This coverage actively showcased the significant value and influence of the “2025 Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program in promoting mutual learning among China-Latin America youth, advancing innovative poverty alleviation practices, and deepening cross-cultural cooperation.

- By empowering Chinese and Latin American youth, the program is essentially cultivating a new generation of talent for future global governance. The mutual trust and friendship these youth established during the event, along with their valuable experience in collaboratively exploring solutions, will form a solid foundation of public opinion and a talent reserve for deepening future China-Latin America and even global cooperation. The program plans to gradually expand from the poverty alleviation topic to the broader field of sustainable development, foreshadowing its tremendous potential as a long-term, institutionalized platform.

In summary, the 2025 “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program achieved remarkable results in model innovation, talent cultivation, practical outcomes, and ecosystem



development. It was not only a successful cultural initiative led by universities in China and Latin America and extending its influence across government, industry, and research sectors, but also a vivid reflection and powerful testament to the deepening China–Latin America cooperation in jointly addressing global challenges and advancing together toward a brighter future.

2. Outlook for Activities

Although the main activities of the “2025 Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program have ended, the promotion work of this year is still continuing. The 2026 “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program is in full swing, **exploring the best cases of poverty alleviation between China and Latin America, building the base of the Poverty Alleviation Challenge program, holding academic forums, attracting sponsorship to support students’ cross-border exchanges, optimizing the competition system** and other aspects.

This event provides young students with valuable cross-border exchange opportunities in terms of motivation. With financial support from **Tsinghua University Latin American Center and various sponsoring enterprises**, 24 students from Tsinghua University participated in the **finals in Chile and Brazil in August this year**; 32 students from Latin American universities who advanced to the finals will travel to China for an exchange in January 2026.

Looking ahead, Tsinghua University will continue to collaborate with Latin American university partners to sustain high-quality “Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program. We will further work with our Latin American university partners to develop the joint course “Chinese-Latin American Youth Responding to Global Challenges”, using this innovative curriculum as a vehicle to concretely expand and strengthen cross-cultural communication channels and practices in poverty alleviation experiences and explorations. By summarizing the valuable experience from this event, we will optimize the competition process to enhance its quality and influence. Under the leadership of Professor Chen Taotao, Tsinghua University’s core



research team will collaborate with the Chinese government, Chinese enterprises in Latin America, and outstanding local enterprises in the region to further study domestic and international poverty alleviation cases and establish demonstration bases for best practices.

Meanwhile, we will promote the event through multiple online and offline channels to increase its visibility and participation, attracting more outstanding students from home and abroad. We will also build partnerships with domestic and foreign enterprises, universities, and research institutions to jointly advance the transformation and application of competition outcomes. Through annual development of the event, outstanding proposals will be continuously iterated and refined until they are implemented on the ground, focusing on their effectiveness and contributing China's wisdom to the global cause of poverty alleviation.

Through the above planning, we believe the “China-Latin American Youth Responding to Global Challenges —— Poverty Alleviation Challenge” program will continue to yield fruitful outcomes, cultivating more young ambassadors for China and Latin America to jointly tackle global challenges, and contributing to the global cause of poverty alleviation.
